Annual Tenders

Corporate Manager Report:

- Last year we issued 6 tenders and received a total of 9 bids.
- This year we standardized the tender packages and issued 10 packages in total. We did a bit
 more to communicate the opportunity to bid we sent a total of 44 letters to companies in
 our business directory and posted public notices per the procedures that were approved by
 Council before the holidays.
- We received a total of 16 bids. Three of the tenders received no submissions.
- Except for the third-party equipment rental and carpentry labour where we are proposing to award tenders on an as needed, lowest bid an availability basis – we propose awarding the tenders to the lowest bidder.
- We believe our efforts to enhance communications resulted in us receiving more bids this year.
- We also feel that by standardizing the tender packages, that the Village is in a better position to deal with any disputes that may arise out of the tendering process.
- For the 3 tenders where we received no submission, we recommend that we proceed with hiring available contractors on an as needed basis. And if there is more than one contractor available, we would request quotes and hire the contractor with the best rate.

Board of Variance Personnel Search

Corporate Manager Report:

- We received an application for a variance to the Zoning Bylaw for a property on Spruce Street.
- We need to establish the required governance structure (per the Bylaw) to review this application.
- The last time a Board of Variance was established was to review an application that was submitted in 2021. At that time, Council passed a motion establishing the terms of reference, and membership criteria, for the Board of Variance.

- A Candidate search was advertised ad four members were appointed for a 1-year term starting on August 30, 2024.
- We reached out to these four members to see if they would be willing to sit another term.
 One member, Elodie Dulac, confirmed her interest and availability to sit another term.
 Another member, Travis Bernard, offered to be an alternate.
- This RTC proposes two options for how we could proceed to identify the additional members we need to constitute the board
 - 1. Identify two additional members by sending out personal invitations to residents recommended by Council
 - 2. Amend the Bylaw or alter the Terms of Reference to expand the conditions for membership on the Board.
- However, just today two community members approached the Village to put their names forward to participate on the board – Lynn Iler and Patty Moore.
- If Council is comfortable with appointing Elodie Dulac, Lynn Iler and Patti Moore as members and Travis Barnard as an alternate member, we would be able to constitute a Board of Variance to review the application.

Discussion:

- What would amending the Bylaw or altering the Terms of Reference to expand the conditions for membership on the Board look like?
 - O Currently our Bylaw enables one Council Member to sit on the Board. Expanding this to two or more could be an option. We looked at membership rules in other Communities, and found it was unusual for Council or Staff to sit on the board. Another option is to expand the conditions for membership and allow residents from outside the community, or residents that have lived here for less than 3 years, who are not currently able to sit on the board, to be able to be members.
- Was the advertisement done in sync with our new approach for sending out information? A
 little concerned over the lack of response as it feels a little bit like apathy.
 - O Yes, it was circulated per our new administrative procedures for communicating public notices. The response may have suffered from the timing the call for applications was open from December 6 to 22nd, which is when folks are busy leading up to the holidays.
